ers, guests, and TC members is another good suggestion I've heard. There will be guidelines to follow to minimize exposure to Covid 19 or other pathogens so bring a mask just in case. Financially I project TC will come within \$1-2K of breaking even worst case scenario. ORP is recognizing our loss of the ability to hold the March and April TT's that were supposed to occur during the Low Price season and adjusting the track rental to reflect that rental rate versus High Price season which includes 9/27. Jim Larfield has been networking along with Joe Harlan and others on TC's behalf promoting our Time Trial events. He reports there's lots of interest, support for, and pent up demand for these types of events. Jim also feels that this is a good opportunity to carry forward the momentum our TT events of 2018-19 created and I totally agree.

In my opinion TC presenting Time Trial competition events is the best business model to keep the Club relevant and to ensure future financial viability. We've observed steady decline in the number of ICSCC licensed racers and entrants to club level racing events for some time. Why? I don't know, but today for a new driver to even be eligible to go on track as a Novice requires at least \$1-2,000 investment in personal safety gear alone!

Today young (and old) people have many options to pursue racing dreams using video game platforms and technologies that are second nature and affordable to them. Spending two grand for personal gear just to try something that will quickly increase to tens of thousands of dollars to participate in, even at the amateur level, is just one of many barriers that limit the pool of applicants to a very small number. The crazy "new normal" time we live in jeopardizes the future of our sport and Club. The entry level commitment of money, time and resources to enter TT type events is going to be so much easier to afford that it may become the way people get involved with and moving up to actually driving a real race car, on a real race track in competition that leads to further involvement in motorsports.

I look forward to your thoughts, ideas and comments and best of all to seeing you at a meeting or race track soon.
