- Any pertinent information that would help us determine your qualification and most effective placement as an instructor.
- Send us your favorite selfie to add to our file.

Four electronic ways to catch speeders

In a meant study conducted for the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the National Bureau of Standards identified four classes of disctronic absent measuring devices used in traffic law enforcement:

1. Electronic speedonieter. It measures the patrol car speed and displays the result on either an analog or digital display. With the analog method, the device produces an eddy current that is proportional to shaft rotation. For the digital method, a magnetic pickup coll generates electrical pusees. Here, frequency is proportional to shaft speed. These speedometers are generally mounted in patrol cars when they are assembled, and their use is limited to pacing—following potential violators. Although their accuracy is guaranteed within = 1 mith at the factory, it changes with tire pressure, rear-axie load, and tire size.

2. Vascar, This device uses the distance between two reference points and the lepsed lime it takes a larget vehicle to case between them to compute and display target vehicle speeds. Vascar is mounted in the patrol car and may need an odometer cable connection if distance fan't programmed manually. After the distance has been programmed, the operator throws switches to indicate when he observes a larget vehicle processing each reference point on the roadway. Generally, operation is limited to stationary

petrol bars, but can be extended to sircraft-based highway patrol applications when the distance between reference points is known alress of time.

3. Orbis. This automatically detects speed violators and photographs idense plates. A new of roadway-mounted samples of a fixed distance apart, detect the passing of a larget variota. As with Vascar, distance and lapsed time are used to compute speed. If a violation is detected, an infrared fitumination source is stroked and a high-speed compare simultaneously photographs the speed and license piete number. Orbis's bulky equipment must be operated either from a stationary vahiots that is at least as large as a medium-sized van or from a permanent housing. Unattended operation is possible. To date, if has been used only on an experimental basis in a couple of oftics in the United State because of potential legal cherienges and its over-over \$20,000 per unit, excluding the Grice of the van.

4. Reder. These devices use an unmodulated GW microwave signal to measure the speed of target venicles through application of the longitudinal Coppler principle. The racers are portfable and may be hand-hald or fixed-mounted. They may be operated with the patrol car stationary or moving. A single unit typically does between \$1000 and \$2500.


